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## 1. Introduction

This deliverable 3.4 is the second of four documents produced within the Work Package 3 (WP3, Task 3.3) with aim of summarize the procedure for funding the joint transitional calls in the frame of JHEP, the first Coordination and Support Action (CSA) for the Joint Programming Initiative “Cultural Heritage and global change: a new challenge for Europe” (JPICH).

The other deliverables foreseen will be:

- Deliverable 3.3 - Report on analysis procedure for call launch (already submitted on December 2013)
- Deliverable 3.5 - Report on procedure for project evaluation; related the lesson learned during the evaluation procedure
- Deliverable 3.6 - Report on testing launched calls, an overall analysis on the experience of both call launched during the JHEP project

According to the JHEP Description of Work (DoW): *This Work Package is dedicated to implementing the Joint Programming Initiative “Cultural Heritage”.*

Work Package 3 is divided into the three following tasks:

- **Task 3.1:** Develop the Action Programme
- **Task 3.2:** Maximizing benefit from existing European initiatives for harmonization of activities within JPICH
- **Task 3.3:** Implementation of the Action Programme  
*New transnational initiatives, e.g. joint calls for proposals will be developed upon recommendation of members of the GB and based on the principle of variable geometry following the research areas identified in Task 3.1. For the dedicated participants, joint calls for proposals will be prepared and the framework for collaboration established. The Task Leader will ensure comprehensive information of the GB/EB and will collaborate with WP5 (Monitoring and Evaluation) Framework for Monitoring and Evaluation in feedback analysis of the initial joint call as well as in order to draw the lessons learned and amend the next joint calls.*

This Deliverable 3.4 addresses one of the most a challenging aspect of transitional calls that is the financial instruments planned, and implemented by the call Participants.

The JPICH launched two calls within the frame of the CSA JHEP “Coordination action in support of the implementation of a Joint Programming Initiative (JPI) on Cultural Heritage and Global Change : a new challenge for Europe Heritage European Programme” and the HERITAGE PLUS Project: i) the JPI-JHEP pilot call in 2013; ii) the JPI-HERITAGE PLUS call in 2014.

The main information regarding number of Participating Countries, Eligible Partners, Call process, Time schedule, Call budget and Funding schema is summarized in Table 1.

This Deliverable 3.4 reports the activities procedure of funding decision and management for the two JPI Cultural Heritage Calls: the JPI JHEP Pilot Call and the JPI Heritage Plus Call.

The Management Group of the respective calls has approved all the documents in support of the decision and management for funding the two calls.

## 2. Funding decision for the JPI Cultural Heritage Calls

### 2.1. JPI/JHEP First pilot call: Countries financial commitment and process documents definition

The first step was the signature of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) by the Countries involved in the JPI/JHEP first pilot call, defined “Signatories” in the MoU as reported in Table 2.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), Annex 1 of the present Deliverable, represents a mutual statement of commitments on the part of the JPI Participants, each of which agrees on:

- a) The available budget for project funding
- b) Financial decision

Point (a) is defined by the signed Signatory’s sheet which includes the project funding assigned by the Signatory to the JPI/JHEP first pilot call. As proved by the MoU (Annex 1) the JPI/JHEP call was entirely funded by the JPI Participating Countries.

Point (b) is defined in Article 7 of the MoU which states:

**“Article 7 - Funding decisions**

*In this **Joint Pilot Call**, each country pays for its own participants based on a **virtual common pot model**. It means that each Signatory will fund those components of the transnational research proposals carried out by nationally eligible teams/partners. This process does not involve transnational flows of national funding, although to strengthen the international dimension to the call, a Signatory may decide to fund applications that include teams/participants from other countries, subject to its national procedures and regulations.*

*Funding by each Signatory will be made according to the respective national research funding framework and regulations. The specific funding rules of each Signatory are provided in the Guidelines for applicants.*

*The decisions on the final funding will be taken by Signatories of the MoU, according to the national procedures and regulations of the participating countries, and taking into account the ranked list of proposals defined according the rules described in this MoU.”*

## **2.2. JPI HERITAGE PLUS call: Countries financial commitment and process documents definition**

The JPI HERITAGE PLUS call was launched within the frame of the Era Net Plus Project funded by the European Commission “ERA-NET Plus on Cultural Heritage and Global Change Research” (HERITAGE PLUS), Grant Agreement n. 618104 (GA), starting date 1.10.2013 and GA Amendment approved by the EC.

The Document of Work (DoW) as Annex of the GA represents the mutual statement of commitments on the part of the JPI Participants, each of which agrees on:

- a) The available budget for project funding
- b) Financial decision

Point (a) is defined in the DoW, as reported in Table 2, that specifies the committed national funding allocated for the HERITAGE PLUS Call by the signed Beneficiaries HERITAGE PLUS Project.

Point (b) is defined in DoW, which states:

“Financing system to fund projects selected from the Joint Call:

*The funding model that will be used in the HERITAGE PLUS call is the mixed mode model. No national/regional funding will cross the borders. The mixed mode – which is the most used model for ERA-NET Plus calls (<http://netwatch.jrc.ec.europa.eu/web/lp/learning-platform/toolbox/call-implementation/funding-decisions/funding-decisions>), helps to ensure that selection decisions can follow the ranking list of the evaluated proposals (which is a ERANET Plus requirement) and that the participating funding countries/beneficiaries maintain their initial commitments. The final decision on which projects are to be funded in an ERA-NET Plus call will determine the amount of budgets to be spent by the funders, and this will influence also the EC contribution. The final EC contribution cannot exceed the ceiling amount stipulated in the Grant Agreement but may be reduced at the end of the ERA-NET Plus activity to reflect the actual funding provided to the projects.*

*When a joint ranking list is arrived at, it is to be expected that funding gaps may appear due to the fact that funding agencies are being requested to fund a number of projects which have a total budgetary requirement beyond that which has been committed by the funding agency. In order to develop a scheme that can deliver on the requirements of an ERA-NET Plus programme, it has been agreed that the requested budgets of proposals admitted into Step 2 cannot exceed 3 times the total budget committed by the HERITAGE PLUS partners. This measure will help to avoid a huge oversubscription of proposals in relation to the budget.*

*To ensure that as many ranked projects as possible following the ranking list can be funded, a second measure (the “mixed mode funding model”) will be introduced by up to 30% of the available EC contribution as a “balancing pot” for filling up the funding gaps caused by a lack of funds available to national/regional funding agencies. The remaining portion of the EC money will be distributed proportionally among the funding agencies based on the actual respective national/regional contributions. A commonly acceptable percentage for such a “balancing pot” is not more than 30% of the available EC money. The final percentage has to be optimized based on the actual outcome.*

*To summarize the principles for distributing the funding:*

- 1. EC and national regulations for funding are applied*
- 2. Funding follows ranking list (top down)*
- 3. A mixed mode funding model is applied*
- 4. No national/regional funding will cross the borders*
- 5. Up to 30% of the EC top-up is used as a balancing pot and the remaining portion will be proportionally distributed based on the actual national/regional contributions.*

*The financial commitments of the 18 partners are 6.2 million Euros as shown in Table 2. However, it is possible that some funding partners wish to fund more projects in which case their contribution will be increased. The maximum EC contribution is that stipulated in the Grant Agreement ( 3.06 million Euros) but the final amount will be determined by the final input of the MS and AC participating to the NET HERITAGE consortium, as reported in Table 2.”*



### **3. Different types of rules and laws in the countries funding the joint calls**

#### **3.1. JPI/JHEP First pilot call: types of rules and laws in the countries funding the joint call**

The JPI / JHEP Call for proposal GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS mentions funding rule at point 2.7 and 4.5 as follows:

*“2.7 Funding rules*

*In this call the eligibility rules of the respective national/regional institutions apply; each partner in a project proposal must be aware of the eligibility rules of the participating national funding organizations.*

*Information on the specific eligibility rules of each participating country is provided in Annex 1. For more detailed information, each applicant should contact the relevant National/Regional Contact Point (see Annex 2).”*

*“4.5 Payment Conditions*

*Payment for a project is subject to national funding rules. “*

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### Analysis of JPI/JHEP Pilot call funding rules

As reported in Deliverable 3.3 in order to improve the call documents content, a short questionnaire was circulated among all the Signatories in order to collect suggestions.

Regarding the Guidelines for applicants, and in particular funding rules, the main comments suggested are focused on the follow issue:

*“...more information generally could have been provided on the eligibility rules for each country, even a A4 per country in the dedicated annex, with a link to the more detailed eligibility criteria.”*

Subsequently to the suggestion raised by the questionnaire the documents for the HERITAGE PLUS call for were modified on the basis of the experiences gained in the JPI/JHEP Pilot call.

## **3.2. JPI/HERITAGE PLUS JHEP call: types of rules and laws in the countries funding the joint call**

The JPI / HERITAGE PLUS Call for proposal GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS mentions funding rule at sections 3 and 4 as follows

### “3. Eligibility

#### Eligible Costs

- *All costs must be eligible according to the national eligibility rules for each country involved in the project, including the maximum eligible cost per country (see next bullet point)*
- *For each project, research teams based in each country can request costs up to the available relevant national funding budget limit given in **Annex A**.*
- *Eligible costs will generally include direct costs such as employment costs, equipment, travel and meeting costs, consumables, dissemination and knowledge transfer costs. Please read the National Eligibility Criteria at **Annex A very carefully** to verify the eligibility of specific budget items according to the rules of the countries participating in your project.*
- *Countries will differ in the available support for non-academic/government/industry partners – please check the National Eligibility Rules for each country (see **Annex A**).*
- *The estimated budget must be given in Euros only.*
- *Recipients of Heritage Plus funding are strongly encouraged to use Open Access publishing wherever possible (see section 6. Open Access Publishing). If publishing under “author pays” regimes is foreseen at the application stage, the related costs should be included in the budget. Costs must be plausible, justified/substantiated and eligible according to the National Eligibility Criteria.*
- *Projects must not exceed **36 months** in duration. Projects must start from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2015 and finish by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018 at the latest.”*

*“4. Finding researchers to collaborate with*

*In order to help researchers or interested partners to find partners in other countries and organisations, an email group (called Heritage Plus) has been set up so that researchers can subscribe to receive such requests, and to post requests themselves.*

*To use this service, you need to subscribe at the following link - <http://www.jiscmail.ac.uk/HERITAGEPLUS>.*

*Once you have subscribed to the service, you can then click on ‘post new message’ to send a message to all subscribers, which will include; your contact details, what type of researchers/partners you are seeking, and a short summary of your idea (maximum 200 words). We would ask you use this format to make it easier for subscribers to quickly see if a request/post is relevant to them.*

*We recommend subscribing immediately but waiting until after 10 Monday March 2014 before posting your request in order to give all countries time to distribute information on the email group and for interested parties to subscribe. “*

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## 4. Procedure adopted for defining the joint selection list of trans-national projects to be funded

### 4.1 JPI / JHEP pilot call

During the 2-days meeting held in Rome on the 18 and 19 July the Signatories of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) took the final decision on the proposals to be funded on a consensus basis, based on the recommendations of the Scientific Committees according to the ranking list and the available budgets.

The proposals with all countries available budget were decided to be funded.

The proposals with high rank and all the Partner's Country available to fund, as reported in following Table as out put of the MoU Signatories Meeting., were included in the List of proposals to be funded:

For proposals in which one partner cannot be fund because the Partner's country have finished its call budget or the budget was not sufficient, the following procedure was agreed and adopted:

1. The country increased its national contribution: UK increased with 180 Keuro (from 750 to 930 Keuro total budget available for funding the proposals), Italy increased with 120 Keuro (from 1.275 to 1.395 Keuro total budget available).
2. The Country/ies budget available to fund the Coordinator/Participant/s for funding the proposals is not sufficient to fund the whole requested budget: after discussion and contact with the Participants a reduction of the funded budget was performed.

The proposal was funded without the Partner(s) of the Country with no budget available according that:

- The reaming Partners are at least from 3 countries as requested in the call.
- The Partner of the Country with no budget available was not the proposal Leader

These proposal(s) were in the reserved list and the Signatory of the Leading Country open with the Coordinator the negotiation.

The Signatories decided that for the proposals negotiation the scope of the proposal needs to be unchanged and the activities of the unfunded Partners, strictly needed for the original goals, must be maintained. The negotiation may include the following options:

- The activities of the unfunded Partners may be spread among the others Partners.
- The Partner with no budget may however agree to participate at the project.
- For networking proposals, the proposal may be funded without the activity of the unfunded Partner

The proposal decided to be in the "Reserved list of proposals for negotiation" are as follows: CHERISCAPE (UK), TANGIBLE (Cyprus), SMARTVALUE (Poland) as in Table Proposal funded.

## **5. Final general recommendations for next calls**

The lesson learnt from the JPI/JHEP Pilot Call was checked through the questionnaire reported in Deliverable 3.3 “Report on analysis procedure for call launch”, which includes major comments on decision process, funding and start of the projects

The major issue raised by the signatories regards the planned time schedule for the establishment of funding grant agreements with the Partners of the funded projects: it is considered unrealistic (i.e. 4 months). This was requested to be revised for the next call.

## **Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)**

### **Article 1 - Preamble**

The Coordination Action JHEP is intended to structure and support the Joint Programming Initiative (JPI) on "Cultural Heritage and Global Change: a new Challenge for Europe" in the implementation of its action programme for the area of research on cultural heritage in a changing world.

The Signatories<sup>1</sup> of the present MoU agree to join forces in order to launch a joint pilot call for research proposals.

### **Article 2 - Purpose of the MoU**

The Signatories consider the present Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to be an important step towards common transnational strategies concerning Cultural Heritage Research, building on the dynamic developed by the JPI and JHEP process.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) represents a mutual statement of commitment on the part of the JPI partners, each of which agrees to make every reasonable effort to fulfil the intentions expressed in the joint pilot call as well as in the financial framework.

It is hereby agreed that the Signatories of the present MoU shall launch a Joint Pilot Call which will be organised under the coordination of the JHEP Coordinator, the Ministero per i Beni e le Attività Culturali (MIBAC), Italy. This call will be financed by the Signatories in a virtual common pot process, using national funding programmes, according to the respective legal framework and regulations of the Signatories.

Each Signatory should designate a contact representative. If there is more than one Signatory per country, it is advisable for a country to designate/identify a National Contact Point to ensure effective communication between the JPI Coordinator and Signatories.

Details on the implementation of the Joint Pilot Call are outlined in the document "Guidelines for Applicants" that will be approved by the Signatories of the present MoU.

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<sup>1</sup>For the purposes of this MoU, a Signatory is a person within an organisation who has the authority to sign this MoU on behalf of that organisation and is also able to commit funding to this Joint Pilot Call.



### **Article 3– Aims of the Joint Pilot Call**

The call has two aims:

- To establish common processes and assessment criteria;
- To enable researchers in different countries to build effective collaborative networks on common transnational research topics around cultural heritage.

The topics for the call are:

- Methods, tools (including non-invasive instruments) and modelling for understanding damage and decay mechanisms (including the effects of weathering and climate change) on tangible heritage (including buildings, sites and landscapes);
- Materials, technologies and procedures for the conservation of tangible cultural heritage;
- Use and re-use of buildings and landscapes, including the relationship between changes of use and public policy, including costs and added value (for example as a result of planning regulations and urban development);
- Increasing understanding of cultural values, valuation, interpretation, ethics and identity around all forms of cultural heritage (tangible, intangible and digital heritage).

A minimum of three research groups, each based in a different country, is necessary to participate in the JHEP Joint Pilot Call.

The call will be advertised simultaneously by the Signatories in accordance with the procedures for their national programmes and will be published on the common website [www.jpi-culturalheritage.eu](http://www.jpi-culturalheritage.eu) as well as on the Heritage Portal at [www.heritageportal.eu](http://www.heritageportal.eu).

### **Article 4 - Duration of the MoU**

The Memorandum shall come into force on the date of its signature by all Parties involved in the call and is valid until the end of the funded projects.

### **Article 5 – Coordination and organisation of the Joint Pilot Call**

The central coordinating body for the Joint Pilot Call is MiBAC *in liaison* with MIUR and it will be responsible for the overall coordination of the call. MiBAC *in liaison* with MIUR shall also be responsible for overseeing the international peer assessment process according to the rules agreed upon by the JHEP Steering Committee (STC) and the JPI Governing Board.



MiBAC will be assisted in its coordination role by the STC, but each of the Signatories must manage any administrative procedures related to successful proposals (for example, responsibility for signing the contract with successful proposals, the administrative collection of financial reporting, etc).

The STC will be responsible for defining and organising the call, including the overall process (the launch, application process and evaluation criteria).

In order to avoid any conflict of interest, individual Steering Committee Members, Executive Board and Governing Board Members, in addition to others directly involved in the assessment, process must not apply to this call.

### **Article 6 –Peer assessment of applications**

The assessment of proposals will be undertaken by the Scientific Committee supplemented, if necessary, by other experts chosen by the Scientific Committee from a new list of independent international experts proposed by JPI Participants. The expertise of the Scientific Committee will, therefore, cover all fields of research addressed in the call.

The final assessment and ranking of proposals by the Scientific Committee will be informed by independent, written peer review for each proposal. The names of the Scientific Committee involved in the final assessment and ranking of this Joint Pilot Call will be published on the JPI CH website [www.jpi-culturalheritage.eu](http://www.jpi-culturalheritage.eu).

MiBAC reports periodically to the committee of the Signatories (JHEP Steering Committee (STC) and the JPI Governing Board) on the progress of the Joint Pilot Call implementation.

The evaluation process will involve the following consecutive steps:

- Each Signatory to check for eligibility based on the rules of its own national funding programme;
- All proposals that pass this initial eligibility check are submitted to the Scientific Committee for an assessment of research quality, taking into account the independent, written peer reviews for each proposal. The Scientific Committee will also rank all the proposals in order of research quality;
- The Signatories shall, according to the ranked list from the Scientific Committee, each assess possible project funding in relation to national funding and in accordance with the funding policies and decision-making of that Signatory;

- The Steering Committee will verify the correct implementation of the evaluation process and application of evaluation criteria;
- The Coordinator will inform the project leaders of the outcome of the funding decisions;
- Finally, each Signatory will form contracts with the successful proposals and participants that it has agreed to fund (see Article 7).

### **Article 7 - Funding decisions**

In this **Joint Pilot Call**, each country pays for its own participants based on a **virtual common pot model**. It means that each Signatory will fund those components of the transnational research proposals carried out by nationally eligible teams/partners. This process does not involve transnational flows of national funding, although to strengthen the international dimension to the call, a Signatory may decide to fund applications that include teams/participants from other countries, subject to its national procedures and regulations.

Funding by each Signatory will be made according to the respective national research funding framework and regulations. The specific funding rules of each Signatory are provided in the Guidelines for applicants.

The decisions on the final funding will be taken by Signatories of the MoU, according to the national procedures and regulations of the participating countries, and taking into account the ranked list of proposals defined according the rules described in this MoU.
